

Prof JJ Tabane is a Professor of Communications at the UNISA School of Business Leadership and Adjunct Professor of Media studies at the University of Botswana. He is the Editor of Leadership and BBQ Magazines and anchor of the award-winning "Power to Truth with Professor JJ Tabane" at eNCA TV. He has served or serves on the boards of Altron, Powertech and University of the Western Cape ("UWC") Foundation; Chairperson of the UWC Media Society, Chair of Finance at UWC and Transformation at North West University ("NWU"); and as council member of the NWU and the UWC. He is author of "Lets Talk Frankly: Letters to Influential South Africans on the state of our nation" and a biography of Major Madisa Mfeka "Yes I am a pilot" and has penned more than 300 opinion pieces since 2006.



Professor Chris Landsberg is the South African National NRF Chair: African Diplomacy and Foreign Policy in the Faculty of Humanities and Senior Associate: School of Leadership at the University of Johannesburg ("UJ"). He is a former head of Politics at UJ. He was a Rhodes Scholar at Oxford, where he obtained his M Phil and D Phil International degrees, alongside a MA International Studies from Rhodes. A former director of the Centre for Policy Studies in Johannesburg and former co-director of the Centre for Africa's International Relations at Witwatersrand University ("Wits"). He has published widely on South African foreign policy and African diplomacy and recently authored The Diplomacy of Transformation: South African Foreign Policy and Statecraft.



Busisiwe Mavuso is a Certified Chartered Accountant, qualified with the Association of Certified Chartered Accountants (ACCA –UK) and holds a Master's Degree in Philosophy in Applied Business Leadership and Management (UCAM – Spanish University), a Master's Degree in Business Leadership (UNISA), a Postgraduate Qualification in Management (GIBS) and a B. Compt in Accounting (UNISA). Busi is currently completing her PhD.



Prof William Gumede is an Associate Professor, Public and Development Management, Political Economy, School of Governance at Wits and Professor, Management, Elsenburg. He is on the Advisory Board of the Global Public Policy Institute, Berlin and is on the Advisory Board of the Global Reporting Centre, University of British Columbia. He teaches an economic development course for members of the South African National Executive (Cabinet) and a course on public policy for Members of Parliament. He is the Founder and Executive Chairperson of Democracy Works Foundation – now based in 8 countries and the Founder of the Institute for Social Dialogue.



Dr Sizwe Mpofu-Walsh holds a DPhil in International Relations from Oxford. His first book, Democracy and Delusion: 10 Myths in South African Politics won the City Press-Tafelberg Nonfiction Award. His second book, The New Apartheid has also been greatly celebrated. Dr Sizwe Mpofu-Walsh is also a broadcaster, having hosted Unfiltered on SABC and a seasoned podcaster, having founded and hosted The SMWX Podcast. Dr Mpofu-Walsh is also a Lecturer in the International Relations Department at Wits.



Prof Dirk Kotzé has been a Political Sciences lecturer at UNISA since 1988. He has been a Council member of the South African Association of Political Studies for 15 years and was also an Executive Committee member (and one of the Vice-Presidents) of the International Political Science Association. His specialisation areas are South African politics and political conflict resolution, with focus areas including elections, negotiations, transitions and democratisation processes. He was also directly involved in the transition processes in South Sudan and Madagascar.



Prof Theo Venter is Professor of Practice at the University of Johannesburg and was previously attached to the NWU Business School until his retirement in December 2020. He is a facilitator, scenario expert, strategist and political commentator. During the 2024 elections was part of the Netwerk24 election analysis team. He holds two master's degrees in political science and is the current chair of the Panel of Experts developing a Growth and Development Strategy for the North West Province and serves as a member of the Council of the NWU.
