

The war is unwittingly woven into the visualization of the 17th Ecumenical Social Week. During the shelling, Ukrainians hide from rockets in underground shelters (subways, basements, and bunkers). In the dungeons, we strive to preserve our lives and our identity. The visual design of the forum features a juxtaposition of light and darkness, which we will definitely overcome.

A Ukrainian embroidered towel with a tree of life on the canvas symbolizes a family or a community, because the branches are paired like a family in a family tree. In the background, we see a grid - the weave of fate on which the tree of life is embroidered. These threads and cloth are connected to each other, just as Ukrainians are connected to each other now: sadness, joy, faith, strength, resilience, language, culture, desire to live, to live in a free country The main color of the embroidery is red: the color of love, of flowers, of the Mother of God, but also the color of blood, of and war. The unifying element of all designs the layouts is the diamond, which symbolizes stability in embroidery. A diamond is also a kind of square, the most stable shape. The significance semantics of the square are matter, fertility, fecundity, and abundance; the four cardinal points, four seasons, flour formative elements, and a connection to one's ancestors. The four sides have unified facets: Mel, family, society, and God. Towels with the tree of life were usually embroidered with the tree of life mainly for weddings, when a new family couple was formed. A girl, embroidering a towel before her wedding, embedded within the symbols her entire family up to the third generation, as well as her vision of her happy family.

The towels symbolize communities of people who have their own values and traditions and want to live and develop, give birth to a new generation, to provide new color, and resist this darkness that has come over them.


