ICESCO THINK TANK FORUM:

Towards a new perception of time

November 10, 2022

CONTEXT

The multiple structural mutations that characterize our era shape our future, dictate our conduct in the present moment and corroborate. if anything, the fleeting aspect of time. Indeed, our perception of time has never been so punctuated by volatility. Subjective, it is in no way dependent on the unalterable temporality. which follows its course and remains hermetic to any fluctuation of any kind. The dyad progress and challenges are thus grafted to the march of time and submits itself in the absolute to its intrepid cadence.

Subordinated to its space-time, the latitude of Human beings to dispose of it seems to diminish with the evolution. The tyranny of the present alters their time-based perception as their sphere of influence, their sector of activity and their position in the inherent value chain (economy, industry, education, etc.) increases. It is now a question of apprehending their relationship to different specific temporalities, in the absence of the universal singularity of time, a split representative of the empirical dimension of modern times. Although determined to pace his daily life at his convenience, Humans are occasionally faced with unforeseen events. Emergency situations imply intrusive bifurcations, rooted in a lack of temporality and a break in linearity. The planning tools allow us to transcend the subjection to celerity in action, sometimes synonymous with oddity, which is inseparable from urgency. Rethinking our perception of time through the prism of revisited planning mechanisms, compensating for the obsolescence of outdated tools, would allow us to maximize our operational margin in the light of a new dynamic strategic diplomacy. Otherwise, humanity will not be able to meet alternative futures with possible beneficial effects.

According to Forbes magazine, «Each year, researchers at the University of Pennsylvania compile and publish a report that lists and ranks the approximately 6,500 think tanks around the world»¹

*Think-tanks*², which are laboratories for the incubation of innovative and proactive ideas that support

the dynamics of Foresight thinking around a wide range of multidisciplinary themes, are intended to present alternative reading grids that aim to enable us to apprehend the future from a new angle, to decipher the past and to make the most of the present moment. These platforms of reflection are operating in large numbers in the Islamic world. However, to date, there is no common multilateral mechanism for exchange and cooperation, nor is there a census.

Within this perspective, ICESCO's Strategic Foresight Center intends to federate and connect the main think-tanks of the Islamic World. This first step of its kind aims at stimulating a constructive exchange between this plethora of think tanks in order to enable them to capitalize on their achievements, share their experiences and best practices with a view to consolidating their strategic positioning and international influence. This common denominator is intended to identify, list and classify these think tanks according to their areas of expertise, degree of influence and relevance of their work. The aim of this global inventory is to develop an annual ranking of the best think tanks in the Islamic world using an evaluation grid and specific performance indicators, similar to the Global Go To Think Tank Index Report³.

ICESCO will host on November 10, 2022 the first ever «ICESCO Think Tank Forum», a high-level international gathering of the most prominent centers, actors and stakeholders in the field of strategic research in the Islamic world.

On the sidelines of the summit, ICESCO will launch the first Women's Think Tank in the Islamic world called «Fatima al-Fihriya Think Tank», an initiative that aims at empowering and supporting women and girls, developing their capacities and skills to improve the status of women in society.

- 1. Federate and connect the main think-tanks operating in the Islamic world around a common network.
- 2. Survey, identify and develop an annual thematic ranking of the best think-tanks in the Islamic world by means of an evaluation grid and specific performance indicators.
- **3. Encourage** think-tanks in the Islamic World to join their efforts in order to foster a better dynamic of exchange and cooperation.

EXPCTED OUTCOMES

Creation of the first network unifying the main think-tanks operating in the Islamic world; Publication of an annual thematic ranking of the best thinktanks operating in the Islamic world; Strengthening their strategic positioning, influence and international influence.

DELIVRABLES

- 1. Creation of a directory listing the main think-tanks operating in the Islamic world.
- 2. Elaboration of the statutes and guidelines regulating the operating framework of the network.
- **3.** Publication of a summary note on the major issues addressed and recommendations made by the stakeholders associated with the summit.

METHODOLOGY

This forum will constitute the first network federating think-tanks operating in the Islamic world, advocating an inclusive and participatory approach, in order to involve the largest number of research structures and stakeholders in its work. This pioneering initiative will include an inaugural thematic conference, followed by exchange, brainstorming and networking sessions, and will be closed by a plenary session to create and adopt the founding texts of the network in question.
