The Morning After - Europe has voted

Monday, 10 June 2024 09:30-10:30 CET Online Event (via Zoom)

The European Office of the Konrad-Adenauer-Stiftung is very pleased to invite you to the next session of our event format "The Morning After". In this online format, we are monitoring the Parliamentary and/or Presidential Elections in European states and discuss the results with our KAS colleagues in the respective country. Furthermore, we try to assess the implications the result could have for the country's relationship with the European Union. This session will focus on the European Union, where the European Elections are scheduled from 06-09 June 2024.

The European Elections 2024 are a landmark election for the European continent. Around 350 million voters in 27 member states are called upon to cast their vote and thus determine the course of the EU for the next five years. After a crisis-ridden legislative period 2019-2024, which had to overcome a pandemic, a war of aggression on European soil and far-reaching geopolitical challenges, expectations for the next five years are at least as high. A strengthened EU defence policy component, the continuation of the economic transformation to achieve climate neutrality in 2050 and the agreement on a new Multiannual Financial Framework (MFF) are just three aspects that will play a prominent role in Brussels and Strasbourg in the coming years. The majorities in the European Parliament will be decisive in the prioritisation of projects, which is why the election results in the 27 EU member states are eagerly awaited. While rightwing populist and far-right parties are expecting strong support in some member states, social democrats and other left-leaning parties are ahead in other states and are hoping that a successful performance in the European elections will provide a tailwind for further electoral decisions. In addition to the election results themselves, particular attention will be paid to the group affiliation of the elected parties and MEPs in the European Parliament - here, too, initial assessments can be made immediately after the election.

What were the election results in the European Elections in the selected member states? What were the issues that characterised the European Election campaign in these countries and what were the priorities of the successful parties? How will the election results affect the role of the respective member state in the European Union?

The event "The Morning After – Europe has voted" will take place on Monday, 10 June 2024, from 09:30-10:30 CET via Zoom. We look forward to discussing the election result with our colleagues in Paris (Anja Czymmeck), Rome (Dr. Nino Galetti), Warsaw (David Gregosz), Stockholm (Gabriele Baumann) and Budapest (Michael Winzer). After the conversation between the aforementioned colleagues and Dr. Beatrice Gorawantschy, Director of the European Office of the Konrad-Adenauer-Stiftung, the audience will have the opportunity to contribute their questions to the discussion. The event will be held in German with simultaneous interpretation into English.
